
RE: Offer of housing and employment for prisoner PF Lazor, Number C-73842.

Dear Mr. Nielsen,

I am writing concerning my brother, PF Lazor, and his upcoming parole hearing. I am still willing, as stated in my previous letter to the parole board of Nov. 19, 1993, to provide a home and job for my brother, PF, in Tennessee. I have a comfortable home with extra space, and I am self-employed, so I can provide a home and work for him.

Since PF's case was an obvious self-defense situation, with proof of an armed intruder in PF's house, which clearly shows self-defense, PF has wrongly served and wasted 13 years of his life in prison! There's no valid reason to keep him incarcerated any longer--he must be paroled! He's obviously not a threat to society. His whole past life shows good, not ill, to mankind, as you know from the numerous testimonials that have testified to his upright character. I strongly urge you to consider the injustice that has been done to PF these 13 years, wasting away in prison, only because he defended himself against a would-be murderer, when his own life was in danger! Please release PF back into society where he belongs, to a life of freedom, which our constitution guarantees him, and you, with others, will see that he is an asset, not a detriment, to our society! Please give him a chance to prove himself, and to enhance our society!
