This letter is to update my previous letters to support the granting of parole to Mr. PF Lazor.

I have known PF since before his imprisonment. He is a very responsible citizen. His non-criminal, non-violent nature and conduct renders him out of place in prison.


Mr. Lazor shot an armed intruder in self-defense with a legal gun when the man broke down his private door in a violent rage. The presently available evidence proves this. After wounding the man, PF immediately called the police and medical personnel to save the attacker's life. He has been imprisoned for this for 22 years, after being acquitted of first-degree murder.

Although steadfastly maintaining that his act was one of self-defense where he panicked under the belief that his own life would imminently have been taken, I personally witnessed PF's expression of grief and remorse over the death of Mr. Allred. His contrition made a powerful impression of me when I visited him at San Quentin in October 1986.

After 22 years of prison life, Mr. Lazor continues to maintain an intelligent and compassionate dialogue with his friends and supporters, including me. I am confident that he will fit in society upon release from prison and that he is equipped to be self-supporting and productive.

I urge you now, on behalf of society: Please grant parole to PF Lazor.
