We have known P.F. Lazor since 1977. We were students of Ohlone College at the same time. He visited our home to see our relay service for the deaf, because he was interested in a proposal he had written to obtain jobs for deaf individuals.

P.F. frequently visited our home and we stored some of his furniture during his move into the area. He was honest, straight forward, very kind and considerate. His interest extended to people of all ages. He was never idle and in creating. things, jobs & etc. for himself, always included others with his good fortunes.

My past interest in the stage, music, speech & etc. kept us naturally in touch with P.F.'s many talents. Because of our age difference, (we are in our sixtys). we did not travel in his social circle, but we did enjoy his BUDDY HOLLY JR. shows and he would frequently call -keeping in touch.

In 1982, P.F. called about a special light my husband had made to use for the deaf and we made him one for his sound (room) studio for his voice and speech classes and to prevent interruptions in his studio when phones would ring (instead a light came on).

I was shocked when the next visit we had, we were told about this unfortunate and alleged killing. We can not believe a person with such warmth & feeling for others could be involved in such a matter. I suppose we were so shocked, we didn't realize all he told us until a later visit to say the progress of the trial "up date". His feelings were in his face and definately in his voice. My empathy for people told me of his suffering.

This man with so much talent, devotion to the community, is most deserving at a time like this of all our concern. We pray he will be released from the pain and misery to a permanent place in our society where he rightfully belongs.
