

We have known of PF's situation for about 10 years now. We have been in ministry related communication with him from the start of our association. Although confined, he has graciously shared his musical talents with many others and us as well.

Over the years, we have become aware of his severe circumstances. We understand that Mr. Lazor shot an armed intruder in self-defense with a legal firearm when the intruder entered PF's premises in a fit of rage. The presently available evidence proves this already. After wounding the man, PF immediately called the police and medical personnel in an attempt to save the would-be assailant's life.

It is our prayer and opinion, in light of our understanding of the questionable nature of his conviction, that the Board of Prison Terms review his case to determine his innocence.

We feel confident that in reviewing his case his innocence will be proven! He has already served over 22 years for his alleged crime. Self-defense is NOT a capital offense; Mr. Lazor should be paroled - he has already been exonerated and acquitted of first-degree murder.
