Dear Sirs:

I have met P.F. Lazor while he was in C.S.P. Lancaster, California. I could not help but feel compassion for this kind, gentle individual who seemed totally out of place in a prison. I understand the basis for his conviction was his shooting of a violent criminal who broke down the door to his home in an effort to attack him. Mr. Lazor shot the man in self defense. For that "crime," Mr. Lazor has spent 22 of the best years of his life in a maximum security prison.

I further understand that his conviction was based on the testimony of the then coroner, Dr. Angelo K. Ozoa, who was later terminated for having demonstrated a pattern of malpractice and misconduct, and for having falsified evidence and committed perjury to cover it up in another case. Dr. Ozoa testified that Mr. Lazor had shot the intruder in the back. Mr. Lazor has always maintained he shot the intruder as he was coming at him. I understand that the intruder's body was cremated so the evidence that could establish Mr. Lazor's innocence has been destroyed.

Having discussed his case with him, I also understand that Mr. Lazor has a strong claim of ineffective assistance of trial counsel.

Aside from the serious wrong that has taken place, it is simply not economically prudent to keep Mr. Lazor in prison any longer. He is no danger to society or to anyone. I recommend his immediate parole as the only right and just measure to take.
